THE POLICE FORCE. -On Sunday last the entire police force were assembled at the Armory for the purpose of partial reorganization, to make the details for the new sub-station at Cottage Grove, and to distribute the fifty men who have been added to the force within the past few weeks. Officer Charles Perry was detailed as Day Station Keeper at the Armory, and Officer William Buckley, Night Keeper. Officer Cramer will be "Roundsmen" at Cottage Grove Station, and Officer Ryder as temporary Station Keeper.
