

KIPLEY TEARS UP 'POLICE DEPARTMENT.

Superintendent Issues General Orders Which Make a Total of 167 Changes in the Force.

SIXTEEN MEMBERS ARE DISCHARGED OUTRIGHT.

Civil Service Law Is Ignored in the Interests of Keeping Up a Big Political Machine.

CAPTS. KOCH, LARSEN, AND BAER SUFFER BY THE EDICT.

Long and Faithful Service and Hard-Earned Rank Set Aside for the Benefit of Ward Workers.

KRAUS SAYS THE PROMOTED ONES WILL FIND THEIR SALARIES SHORT.

Superintendent Kiplely last evening gave the Police department the greatest shaking up it ever received in the history of Chicago. When he got through there was not a Republican holding a place higher than desk sergeant, and so few of them they would not figure in a village census. The civil service law was ignored as a thing of no consequence. The main order affects 158 members of the department. Its extent may be judged from the fact that one out of every twenty members of the force was either dis-

Full Text of the Order.

The order of the Chief in full is as follows:

charged, retired, reduced, or promoted last night. An earlier minor order affecting nine places makes the total number of changes 167.

Without an exception all the promotions were of Democrats, many of them officers who had formerly attained rank on the force on account of political service and were reduced when a demand came for policemen and not politicians in the department.

Racial as well as political considerations seem to have been taken into account in preparing this remarkable general order, for the discharged or reduced men, with hardly an exception, show by their names they are of American or English birth, while, with a few exceptions, the officers put in their places are Irish.

Big Political Machine.

In one general order the police force of Chicago has been turned into a big political machine.

Captain Koch of the Harrison Street Station has been retired, and Sergeant William Dollard put in his place. Captain Koch was an excellent officer, and never meddled in politics, but he voted the Republican ticket. Dollard is notorious as an active Democrat, and will be expected to help John Coughlin and "Hinky Dink" Kenna carry First Ward primaries.

Captain Larsen has been reduced to a Lieutenant, and Lieutenant Rehm put in his place. Captain Larsen was one of the best officers on the force, but like most Scandinavians was a Republican. Rehm is a Democrat.

Captain Baer is discharged. He had the misfortune of not only being a Republican, but a nephew of Inspector Schaack, and was given no mercy. Captain Barcal, who succeeds him, is a Democrat, as is Sergeant Mike Hoffman, who takes Barcal's place.

Politics in It All.

So it goes on down through a long list. The civil service law has been evaded in the cases of promotions by making a sergeant or patrolman an "acting" Captain or Lieutenant instead of giving him the full rank.

"That can be done under the law," said Commissioner Kraus last evening, "the difference being the officer can draw only pay for his actual rank in the service and not for the position he is filling as an 'acting' officer."

It is taken for granted, however, it is the intention of Superintendent Kiplely to let these "acting" appointments stand during his term as head of the department, and totally ignore the civil service law in the matter of making promotions. This, of course, will make a slight difference to the promoted men in the matter of their pay, as they can only draw it for the rank they hold on the books of the Civil Service commission.

Mayor Harrison Explains.

Mayor Harrison said last evening the reason all the promotions had been made as "acting" was because the Civil Service commission had no eligibles for any of the ranks filled except Captain, and he was not willing to hold Captains came under the operation of the civil service law until it had been so decided by the Supreme Court in the mandamus case now pending. No explanation is given, however, why, if there are no eligibles, sixty-day appointments were not made, in which case the promoted men could draw the higher pay.
