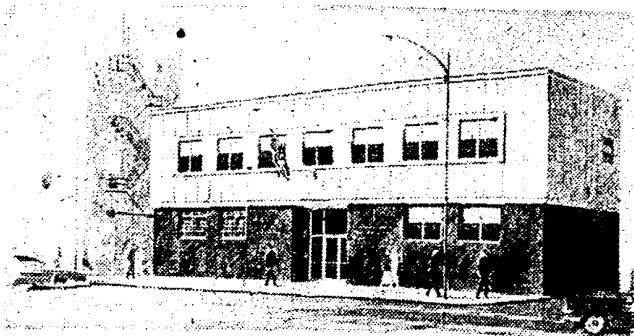


## Sketch of New Police Station

Three contracts totaling \$432,996 for construction of a new police station at 113 W. Chicago av. were awarded Tuesday by the city's purchasing department.

The station, planned as a two story building of granite and Indiana limestone, will have police facilities, a lockup with 15 cells, and a courtroom. A 75 car parking lot will be provided at the rear of the building. The police district's headquarters for the last year or so have been in the city's

central office building at 320 N. Clark st.

Contracts were awarded to H. Ray Anderson & Associates, \$365,410 for general work; Continental Plumbing company, \$30,488 for plumbing; and Jansen & Son, Inc., \$37,098 for ventilating fans and heating.

Within three weeks the city will advertise for bids for a new police station at Wallon and Wood streets. It will replace the Racine avenue station, which is to be razed for the Northwest expressway.
